


Open up the Library on the left side of the dashboard. Click on <u>Articles</u>. Choose "<u>Clinical Skills</u>".






You can now choose between different resources.

Step by step, you can learn how to approach an examination and what needs to be taken into consideration in each respective body system.






2) Clinical cases: This is where you can practise what you have learnt. After reading "Tips and tricks for clinical skills exams", you will find 40 clinical cases which you can use to roleplay with your fellow students or by yourself and practise different scenarios just like during OSCE/CPSA. You will find "Examinee Instructions", the "Patient Encounter" (including "Focused History", "Focused Physical Examination" and "Communication and Interpersonal Skills"), the "Patient Note", where you can take notes on your approach & findings, and "Further Discussion" with background information and tips. You will be guided through the case with check boxes so you don't miss anything that needs to be covered. There is video material throughout the cases to give you examples on how to examine correctly.





3) <u>Procedures</u>: Here you find articles on different procedures such as <u>nasogastric tube placement</u> etc, including graphics, photographs and videos. During medical studies, this is most relevant for procedures needed for placements/rotations, i.e. peripheral venous access, wound treatment, local anaesthesia.












6) Auscultation topics

A physical examination technique that involves listening to internal sounds of the body (e.g., heart, lung, and bowel sounds), typically using a stethoscope. The sound-based videos allow you to listen to the sounds the heart or lungs make based on the location of the stethoscope. There are around 40 of these videos and animations within AMBOSS
